

HOLY WEEK

Holy Week opens with great joy: crowds acclaim Christ as king and hold a parade in his honour: "Hosanna to the son of David!" The liturgy relives this joyful moment in the procession with the palms. Then the mood of Holy Week changes. The account of the Lord's passion is read solemnly on Sunday, and again on Friday. The readings on the first three weekdays speak of the suffering servant and of the treachery of Judas.

Holy Thursday: Jesus gives himself as the bread of eternal life and the cup of salvation. He establishes the priesthood, and gives the sign of true ministry, service, by washing the feet of his disciples. He bequeaths his Church a new commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you."

Good Friday: The solemn reading of the passion is followed by prayers for the entire world. The dramatic veneration of the cross leads into a simple communion service.

Holy Saturday: is a vacant day, a day of quiet prayer and fasting in preparation for the great Easter Vigil which will take place in the darkness of that night.

Holy Week in our Homes: Our family schedule should be rearranged so that all can take full part in the parish services this week. The branches blessed on Sunday are put in places of honour, reminding us that Christ is king of our lives.

ABSTINENCE

Please remember Good Friday is a day of ABSTINENCE and FASTING; meaning that all Catholics must not eat meat, and those who are between the ages of 18 and 59 should have only one full meal and two smaller ones that do not equal the main meal.

SECOND COLLECTION

There will be a second collection on Easter Sunday.

Entriamo nella settimana santa non per risoffrire – sarebbe macchinoso e innaturale – ma per ringraziare, rafforzare la nostra fede, riaffermare la nostra fedeltà a Cristo.

Le parole di questa lettura sono messe dal profeta Isaia sulla bocca del personaggio che va sotto il nome di servo del Signore: sono elencate torture che Gesù effettivamente soffrì nella sua passione.

Questo inno cristologico, probabilmente in uso presso varie comunità, fu inserito da Paolo nella lettera ai Filippesi: descrive la ricapitolazione della storia di Cristo. Il Figlio di Dio si è rivestito della nostra umanità, l'ha salvata e l'ha portata in seno alla divinità.

Dal racconto della passione prendiamo spunto per dire a Cristo che non dimenticheremo, che gli saremo fedeli, anche quando sarà difficile e costoso.
